TALKING SENIORS' GOLF: JULY 2019 The Newsletter of Lancashire Super Seniors

Now the season is in full flow we have plenty to talk about this month with reports on the matches against Bentham, Isle of Man and South Lancs/Ashton-in-Makerfield. One important announcement is the straight swap of venues for the Palatine Trophy and End of Season Competitions. The dates remain as before, 16th September for the End of Season Competition at Dunscar GC (previously Manchester GC) and 7th October for the Palatine Trophy at Manchester GC (previously Dunscar GC). Three matches to look forward to during August against Morecambe, Cumbria and Denton and then we're into the Autumn, with September and October matches and events wrapping up another successful season.

2020 fixtures are already taking shape with dates and matches secured, including the new match against Formby GC Seniors.

LANCASHIRE SUPER SENIORS 5 BENTHAM SENIORS 7 9th July:

On a damp, misty Pennine day, the action on the golf course heated up with the hosts scrambling a closely fought victory. Eric Ball's LSS charges gave an excellent account for themselves, coming within a whisker of a tied match as Eric and Alan Swift (Hesketh) just failed to secure a half on the 18th against Mike Curwen and Dave Minton. Dave, who was on PNE's books during the early 1960's, shared memories of the Deepdale club afterwards in the bar with Keith H, another lifelong PNE fan.

Bentham's welcome, facilities and course continue to impress, as year on year the club and course pile improvement upon improvement. Friendships (and rivalries!) made over many years are rekindled and the newly constructed holiday chalets adjacent to several fairways prove Bentham GC is on the up and up. The Hesketh pairing of Chris Rogers and Clive Wilson finished all square against Mal Hind and Rob Partington, but the one under gross scoring by Neil Dalton (West Lancashire) and Mal Morton (Formby) proved futile against Les Crohill and John Nicholson, going down on the 15th. However, Neil's eagle at the 2nd was some consolation for his first visit to Bentham.

S&A's Allan Harrison was virtually level par for the 18th holes, but partnered by Keith H, also succumbed on the 16th against Ian Slough and Dave Foster. And then....and then....our LSS tail kicked in with Peter Hampsey/Ronnie Webster and Steve Daynes/Rob Squire winning their matches out in the country.

Mike looked forward to the 2020 match, adding how much Bentham look forward to their annual tussle with LSS. As a post script to the match, Keith H adds an interesting snippet of information about the pronunciation of Bentham. A recent magazine article reveals the phonetically correct correct 'Bent-ham', not Bentham, as used by long-term residents to Upper and Lower Bentham . Apparently, ask any Bentammer, and the 'h' is dropped. Recorded in the 1086 Domesday Book, the Oto English name was 'Beonet Ham', meaning homestead in the bent grass. The moorland that surrounds Bentham is covered in thick reedy grasses that grow in watery places. Both High and Low Bentham lie in the valley below. Later names were 'Beny Hame' 'Bent Haim' 'Bent Heim' or 'Bentum'.

LANCASHIRE SUPER SENIORS 2 ISLE OF MAN SENIORS 10: Morecambe GC; 25th July:

Long in the planning, the first match against Geoff Skillicorn and John McMullen's IoM team didn't disappoint, even allowing for all that circumstances and the weather threw at the 2018 and 2019 matches. Many will remember the complete closure of the M6 north of Preston last year on the morning of the match scuppering the chances of players south of Preston reaching Morecambe GC.

Keith G, Geoff and John, together with Rory Callan strove to arrange the 2019 match at Morecambe and whilst thunderstorms and lightning curtailed action on the course, both teams enjoyed a splendid day together.

Keith G takes up the story of the day, "We discussed what should occur in the likelihood of the weather and decided whatever the position at play being suspended, that was the match result. Rory, John and myself agreed this the best course of action. All the players assembled and, in viewing the IoM team sheet, I realized we were facing quite a challenge with IoM's Mark Pugh off scratch and the remainder five or six handicap. As the games began, we could see we may not be able to finish with thunder & lightning getting ever closer. Once it arrived overhead, everyone was called off the course with safety our top priority. The first match had reached the 14th and the last match the 10th.

Rory was able to bring the post-match meal forward and we were joined by Stephen Rooke from Cumbria Seniors, plus the Captain of Morecambe GC who presented the 'Irish Seas Challenge Trophy' to the IoM Match Captain, John McMullen. After dinner speeches were made by Rory, Morecambe GC's Captain, John and myself, all thanking Rory and the club for their hospitality and presentation of the golf course. Rory did a fantastic job as non-playing LSS Match Captain and host, ensuring everything went smoothly, touring the course on a buggy and shepherding players off the course.

All players, and I mean all players thoroughly enjoyed the day, match and format with discussions taking place during the day for a 2020 Round Robin series involving LSS, IoM and Cumbria, as an 'away' fixture in the IoM."
