KEITH GARDNER – TRIBUTES FROM HIS LSS GOLFING COLLEAGUES:

KEITH HICK, LSS SECRETARY, WRITES:

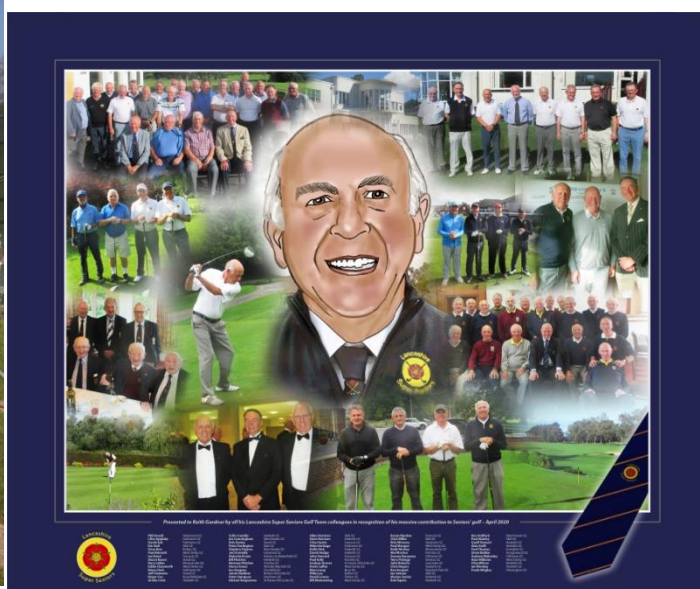
"This month we pay tribute to LSS Team Captain, Keith Gardner, who passed away on Thursday 16th April 2020. Keith's diagnosis of inoperable Liver Cancer, during the second half of 2018, came out of the blue. There had been no advance warning and it was only by chance Keith learnt the devastating news. This occurred the day following our LSS match against Bolton Golf Association at Dunscar GC when an impromptu eye test revealed further tests were required, leading to the diagnosis.

Recovering from the shock, both to himself and his family, Keith remained committed to all that mattered in his life. Adopting a 'business as usual' approach, it was less than easy for everyone who knew him, family, friends and golfing pals, to realise his time was limited.

Nevertheless, this was the mark of the man, continuing to pour energy and commitment into LSS. During our oft and long telephone conversations in ensuring the continuation and evolution of our 'baby', Keith recognized the need to secure someone to replace him when the time arose. Thankfully, Keith's Stand GC colleagues, Jeff Clements and Stuart Bourn, agreed to assume the tasks associated with the role of Team Captain.

Sharing his plans with our LSS Working Party, acceptance was immediate and, as the 2019 season got under way, it was 'business as usual'. The 2019 Pre-Season Day at Stand GC was another success. As matches were ticked off the Fixture List, Keith played and captained the team with his usual mixture of enthusiasm and aplomb, all whilst providing the engine room of team selection and generally overseeing all ran like clockwork.

And so was born the idea of presenting Keith with a gift from his LSS colleagues, discretely agreed by our Working Party members late last year as a means of saying a huge "thank you" to Keith from all our LSS players, past & present.

Conceived and designed by myself, our gift took the form of a photo montage (shown above), and carries the names of everyone who has represented LSS between 2015-2019. The montage incorporates

photographs taken at various LSS matches over the past five seasons with a central portrait of Keith G by USA-based British Artist, Dave Foster, with Winter & Kidson Multi Media producing the printed artwork Arrangements were made for Jeff Clements to deliver the montage to Keith at his home, in lieu of the original idea of presenting the montage to Keith at our 2020 Pre-Season Day. Keith was thrilled and delighted saying, "It is fantastic – please pass on my thanks to everyone at Lancashire Super Seniors". We are pleased to report that Keith, together with wife Maureen, were quite intrigued about this 'special delivery from LSS' and were thrilled upon opening the package to see the contents. Recollections of LSS matches, the length and breadth of Lancashire, came flooding back, together with all the players and organizers who had become such good golfing pals.

Although the circumstances of the 'presentation' were a little unusual, with Jeff Clements handing Keith the framed montage 'over the garden wall' owing to the current social distancing regime, the handover was successful.

Working with Keith was a pleasure and a joy. In late 2014 we each recognized the demand by County Senior colleagues, whose handicaps and age debarred further representational status, to retain some form of continuity. Our combined skillset of O&M, contacts and 'can-do' attitude ensured our team-mates' desires were fulfilled. The end result is what we enjoy today. We set our goals high and standards higher; every single player who has represented LSS has helped fulfill that early promise.

A few years ago we visited Ashton & Lea GC, where Keith was a member in the late 60's. I vividly remember his pride when he showed me the 1969 Captains Prize honours board, with his name in gold leaf. Present-day Penrith GC member, John Pinder, together with Keith, Penwortham GC's David Webster and myself enjoyed a game at Hesketh in 2018 to rekindle old golfing memories, with John and Keith recalling their time as club colleagues at Ashton & Lea some fifty years earlier.

A keen student of the game, to Keith every shot demanded absolute concentration and wo-betide the shot slightly mis-timed or off-line – the next one would invariably be to his satisfaction. A single-figure handicap golfer for the majority of his life, a one-time member of the LUGC Executive, Council Member and Past Captain of Stand GC, Keith's home club announced the ultimate honour recently, electing him as an Honourary Member.

In concluding this personal tribute, I simply say, thank you, Keith – for everything.

My heartfelt condolences go to Keith's wife, Maureen and all Keith's family".

Berating himself for what he considered to be a poor shot – (It wasn't a bad one really!) His strength, courage and fortitude were incredible. He did not want me or others to have pity; he wanted us to go on as normal during the short time we both knew he had. So that meant discussions/late evening phone calls about the LSS 2020 season. Topics of conversation whilst playing golf included, would Preston North End get promotion, what were the R&A going to do about the (Unfair – to low handicap golfers) handicap system and slow play, etc..

When I saw him to deliver the LSS Montage I could see he was starting to fade. That was the last time we spoke.

Stand Golf Club will when appropriate honour his passing.

I will miss him.
