End of Season day feedback compiled by Paul Stanley:

Points made at the End of Season meeting during the season's review:

- We need to recruit more low handicap golfers (less than 4 h/c) so that we can be more competitive in our scratch matches please put the word about.
- Regrettably no one has yet put their name forward to take over the Captaincy from Clive again please put the word about and consider whether you may be able to take on the role. (We have a planned Working Party meeting towards the end of this month, when one of the key issues will be to discuss how we can reduce the Captain's workload to make the role less time consuming and demanding.
- We need more people to come forward and help on the Working Party and hopefully take on some of the administrative work currently undertaken by the Captain. (Graham Slater has indicated he may be able to offer some time)

Thoughts / Ideas from the meeting:

- Match Day Captains to take on more responsibility for the team. After initial team selection they become responsible for team pairings / co-ordinating and if necessary, sourcing any substitutes / running the day / collecting fees and preparing the match report.
- What's App group working well possibly need to monitor it's use with some unnecessary / excessive postings.
- Ensure that Team sheets and any revisions, when posted on website, are dated so that a view of how current they are can be made (explained that it is a moving target to ensure match sheets are fully up to date and What's App probably a better medium for conveying any last-minute changes.)

Ideas to reduce the Captain's workload / make the role more attractive:

- Reduce the number of events (potentially there would be 20? next season if we play the Cumbria match)
- Recruit a Vice-Captain to share the workload
- Make the position for a defined period (say 2/3 years)
- Split out some of the administrative work for others to do i.e.

- o Maintenance of Current Member's List
- Compilation of Season's Fixture list / Emailing details to members / Receiving notification of availability
- o Liase and assign Match Team Captains after return of member's availability
- Compile 1st run of Team Sheets for matches and circulate (Web site and opening match)
- o Dealing with orders for team kit (currently dealt with by Paul Stanley)
- Any other?

"The Making of a Coach" by PGA Master Professional, Howard Bennett: (Available on Amazon from November 2024):

Howard's recently published book, published to help raise money for charitable causes and looking back on his career, has 17 chapters, 159 pages covering, "The Universe of Life" and all that that includes, as Howard explains:

- "Starting from being being born in Southport, and the challenges I had as ayoungster, with two years in the Merchant Navy, then doing two years National Service with the RAF, then eventually spending 63 years being involved in golf with all its challenges.
- I was truly blessed in my life and to have the opportunity of being involved in the game of golf in some way, there has been many challenges, as one would expect.
- As you will read in chapters 16/17, a small quote, "my school teachers often quoted that I was determined, perhaps even stubborn at times, so those who doubted me would only have fuelled my ambition to do well, and there is so much more to learn from those two pages. Finishing with another short clip from the book, I'd like to with quotes from pages 147/8/9: "A coach can never know the full extent of their influence".
- I have been fortunate to work with some amazing athletes who have become household names.
- It gives me great satisfaction to know that I have contributed to their performance and been a small part of a career in golf that in some cases even exceeded their expectations.

- One player I reached out towhen collecting stories for this book wrote to me about the struggles he had faced. This player, who I first taught as a teenager had a scratch handicap and had great potential, but had gone through a rough time etc, etc. The writer of that letter wanted me to share their story, and to respect their wishes.
- I have chosen to anonymise the following text. Here is a story that helps me realize the
 power of dealing with every person as an individual by concluding on the last few words
 and sentence of the letter to me: "I gues I'm trying to tell you that your coaching had
 more of an effect on me off the course in dealing with my mind and emotions to
 overcome my difficulties and setbacks. I'm grateful that we met and that I could learn
 from you. I needed to hear what you had to say about golf, but perhaps more
 importantly, it's how I used it to survive and possible even stay alive".
- The letter above had a profound effect upon me. I am glad I was able to help him. **Howard Bennett**
